VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

St. Vincent's Hospital requires volunteers for the Anglican Eucharist on the second Tuesday of the month. The service takes place at 2:00 PM in the chapel, level 5. Volunteers are usually available about 1 hour before the Eucharist to assist the patients to the chapel / to prepare the altar / to "meet and greet" the patients as they arrive in the chapel; volunteers attend the Eucharist; and finally assist the patients back to their rooms. TOTAL TIME: 2 hours (give or take) ...in this case, 1-3:00 PM. ALL VOLUNTEERS are expected to participate in a screening process for health and security, they are also expected to complete an orientation program of 8 hrs. (2 evenings of 4 hrs.)
