TODAY'S MUSIC

Harold Darke was organist at St. Michael's Church (Cornhill) in London from 1916-66, except for a brief period beginning in 1941 when he filled in at King's College (Cambridge) while the organist of King's (Boris Ord) served in the war. It is widely accepted that the Cornhill Lunchtime Organ Recitals series begun by Darke in 1916 is the longest-running lunchtime organ concert series in the world. *St. Peter* is the name of the hymn tune for our gradual hymn. Mary Lynn Lightfoot's setting of *Jubilate Deo* is consist of many syncopated rhythms, capturing the excitement of the words. Bach's *Little Prelude in C Major* comes from a collection of 8 Preludes and Fugues that were probably composed by one of Bach's sons or students.
