Sheep May Safely Graze is a transcription from Bach's Canata 208 (originally written in 1713 for the birthday of Duke Christian of Saxe-Weissenfel). The transcription was arranged by S. Drummond Wolf, a former organist of Christ Church Cathedral in Montreal. The anthem *All Things Bright and Beautiful* uses an English traditional melody from the 17th century known as *Royal Oak*. Bach's *Prelude in C Minor* begins with an extended pedal solo.
