TODAY'S MUSIC

2009 is the 200th anniversary of the birth of Felix Mendelssohn. German by birth, much of his success was in England through his choral music. His *Trio in F* was one of several of Mendelssohn's pieces that were rediscovered just over 20 years ago, after being stored in Poland for safe keeping during the world wars. His *Fugue in G Major* comes from a collection of the *3 Preludes and Fugues* composed in 1837 for Thomas Attwood, organist of St. Paul's Cathedral in London. Richard Greig's anthem *O Taste and See* (which uses verses of today's psalm) was composed in 1998 for the choir of St. John's Cathedral in Winnipeg.
