TODAY'S MUSIC

It was not uncommon in France to have parts of the mass played on the organ and not sung. François Couperin (1668-1733) wrote two organ masses, and today's voluntaries are taken from his *Mass for the Convents*. The *Offertoire* would have been played at the time of the offertory. The *Fugue on the Trumpet* is the 2nd couplet of the *Kyrie* (Christ, have mercy). Christopher Tye was organist at St. George's Church, Windsor Castle. Two of our hymns were composed by great composers. Henry Purcell (former organist of Westminster Abbey) composed the music for our offertory hymn (it is actually part of his anthem *O God, Thou art me God*). Music for our recessional hymn was composed by Herbert Howells—one of the significant composers of English choral music in the 20th century.
