TODAY'S MUSIC

Cantilène was composed by William Reed (1859-1945), who lived almost his entire life in Quebec. The melody is heard on the oboe stop. Malcolm Archer was organist at Wells Cathedral before he was appointed to St. Paul's in London in 2004. A syncopated rhythm gives the familiar text *Rejoice! The Lord is King* a new lease on life. Healey Willan served as organist of St. Mary Magdalene Church in Toronto almost for 47 years. His *Fugue in B minor* was composed in 1909, when he still lived in England.
