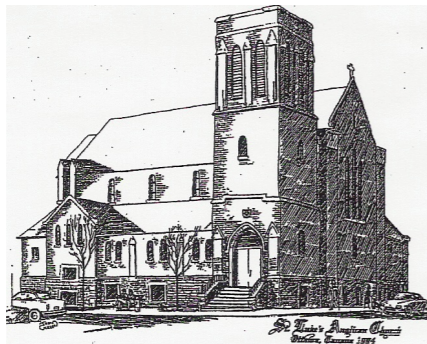

TODAY'S MUSIC

Our recessional hymn is sung to the Irish tune *Slane*. John McIntosh was my thesis advisor at the University of Western Ontario and wrote this Prelude and Fugue in memory of his colleague Larry Cortner (my organ professor at UWO), and it was premiered at the 2005 RCCO convention in London by my University of Windsor organ professor David Palmer. 2010 is the 200th anniversary of the birth of English organist and composer Samuel Sebastian Wesley. He held several cathedral posts, including Hereford, Exeter, Winchester and Gloucester. His anthem *I Will Arise and Go to My Father* is written in homophonic style (all voices move at the same time, like in a hymn) and is based on today's gospel reading. The *Slane* setting for the postlude was composed by William France—organist of Dominion-Chalmers United Church from 1950-80.
