TODAY'S MUSIC

Today marks the 325th anniversary of the birth of J. S. Bach (in Eisenach, Germany). The *Fantasia in C Minor* consists of 5 parts. The theme, which is first heard in the soprano voice, is imitated in the subsequent voices. The anthem is based on a chorale that was harmonized by Bach, but arranged for choir (a dialogue between the sopranos and the rest of the choir) by Clarence Dickinson. The postlude comes from a collection of 45 preludes for the liturgical year.
