TODAY'S MUSIC

The music of German organist Max Reger (1876-1913) was influenced greatly by Beethoven and Brahms and one of the characteristics is that he uses the full range of dynamics (from very soft through to very loud). Reger's *Benedictus* (Blessed is He who comes) was published in 1901. David Halls anthem *Hosanna to the Son of David* uses the familiar Palm Sunday text. Perhaps imitating the crowd that witnessed Jesus' entry into Jerusalem, the anthem starts softly, and gets louder throughout. The anthem *Drop, Drop, Slow Tears* is based on Orlando Gibbons' hymn tune *Song 46* (CP 49). One doesn't normally associate Brahms with the organ, but he did compose some pieces for the King of Instruments. In fact, his last set of compositions (Opus 122) is the 11 Chorale Preludes for Organ, of which *O Dearest Jesus* is the second in the collection.
