**TODAY'S MUSIC**

We are delighted to welcome Joshua Zentner-Barrett who is assisting at the organ today. Josh won a scholarship last year to begin organ lessons, and is a student of Pamela Hoswitschka. Blind from birth, Louis Vierne was the organist at Notre Dame in Paris from 1900 until his death—during a recital at Notre Dame—in 1937. His *24 Pièces en style libre* were written for the harmonium or organ and were intended “during the ordinary duration of the offertory” in a mass. *Berceuse* (Lullaby) is the 19<sup>th</sup> in this collection, and Vierne dedicated it to his daughter Colette. The anthem *This is the Day* was written in the 16<sup>th</sup> century. Like our first hymn, its text comes from today's psalm. The anthem has two themes, and both are used in canon (like a round). Christ the Lord is Risen Again marries the text of Hymn 206 with the music of Hymn 263. Dorothy Wells' *Fanfare for Easter* shows off the trumpet stop in a festive way.
