## TODAY'S MUSIC:

*Nicæa* is the name of the hymn tune for our processional hymn. John's Marsh's *Prelude on 'Nicæa'* features the melody in the top voice, in long-valued notes. The Rev. Michael Wright—long-time friend of Robert Jones—is now the rector of Grace Church in Charleston, SC. He has written many hymn texts. *Hymn For Trinity* was written when he was the rector of All Saints' Church in Peterborough. We thank Gwyneth Price for playing her recorder during the anthem, by Canadian composer Richard Baker. François Couperin (1668-1733) was organist at St-Gervais Church in Paris. He composed two organ masses (pieces played during the mass, rather than sung). The *Fugue sur la Trompette* uses the trumpet stop on the organ.
