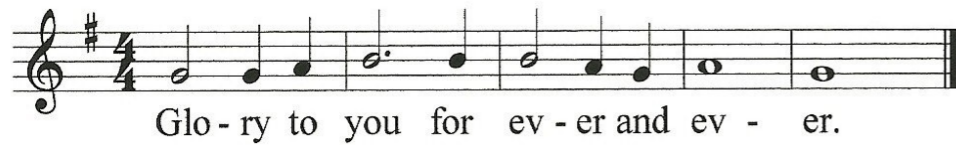

### TODAY'S MUSIC:

Bach's early compositions were influenced by Italian composers, including Antonio Vivaldi. Throughout his life, Bach transcribed (re-arranged) music of other composers, as well as some of his own music. Four of Vivaldi's violin concertos are examples. The *Adagio* is the middle movement from a *Concerto in A Minor*. *Sing a Song of Thanks* is another transcription. It comes from a choral work, a setting of the canticle *Magnificat*. The Gospel Alleluia we are singing today (CP 710) is the refrain from the Easter hymn *O Sons and Daughters*. Our offertory hymn (CP 457) uses the same hymn tune with a text suited towards our gospel reading. The postlude is a *Fantasia* (like an improvisation) based on the hymn tune *O Sons and Daughters* (*O Filii et Filiae*).
