## TODAY'S MUSIC:

Today we are celebrating the bicentennial of Samuel Sebastian Wesley (born August 14, 1810). His grandfather was Charles Wesley (who founded the Methodism and the writer of many hymn texts, including our communion hymn) and his father was Samuel Wesley. S. S. Wesley was organist at several cathedrals during his career (Hereford, Exeter, Winchester and Gloucester) as well as Leeds Parish Church. *Lead Me, Lord* (the text is from today's appointed psalm) is an extract from the anthem *Praise the Lord, O My Soul* which was written in 1861.
