### **TODAY'S MUSIC:**

Frank Bridge studied composition under Charles Stanford at the Royal College of Music. The *Adagio* begins quietly, builds to a full sound on the organ before ending as quietly as it began. Andrew Carter was a bass in the choir at York Minster and was founder-conductor of the Chapter House Choir. A notable moment in his musical career was a commission in 1997 to write a mass (*Missa Sancti Pauli*) for the tercentenary celebration of St. Paul's Cathedral in London. His setting of *For the Beauty of the Earth* was published in 2001.
