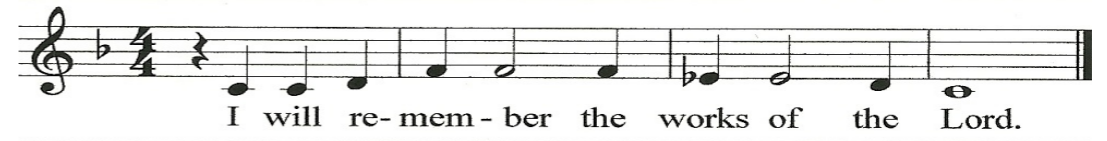

TODAY'S MUSIC:

In recognition of Canada Day, the organ voluntaries were composed by Canadian composers. William Reed (1859-1945) was organist at several churches in Quebec city during his career. He became deaf early in his career, so after 1913, he only composed and wrote articles for magazines. A *cantilène* is a lyrical melody. One of my favourite hymns from the 1971 'red' hymn book was *O God of all the Many Lands*, which was originally written for the 60th anniversary of Canada's confederation, and then was updated for the 1967 centennial. It is unfortunate that it was not included in *Common Praise*. David Cameron was organist at Chalmers United Church in Kingston for over 40 years. His *Prelude on 'Sine Nomine'* is included a book of organ music in memory of former Ottawa organist Gerald Bales. *Sine Nomine* is the tune we are using for our recessional hymn.
