through Christ our Lord. Amen.**

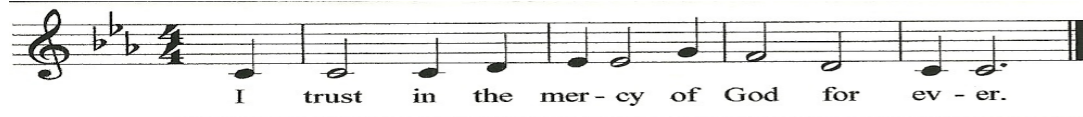
