THE ARTISTS

Renowned for her exquisite sense of language, **Mary Wiggin** is a subtle master of the literary tale. Her wit flashes with quicksilver humor; her insight unveils hidden truths in poetic turns of phrase. She favours folktales and fairytales with strong heroines and sound plots, but her listeners should be ready for some surprises. Her rock-solid, no-nonsense delivery style is the perfect set-up for the uncanny and the fantastic.

Kathie Kompass' desire is to light a verbal candle, drawing the audience closer as adventures from history, mythology and life unfold. A teller with 25 years experience Kathie enjoys the words and images of older stories as well as the brevity and punchiness of a modern tale. She has been storytelling in schools in eastern Ontario, for the Girl Guides of Canada, for churches, libraries and at festivals in Ottawa and Toronto. She was co-chair of the Ottawa Storytelling Festival 2004 and 2005, co-chair of Ottawa's 4th Stage series 2006. She has lead the Introduction to Storytelling Workshop fro Ottawa Storytellers on several occasions.
