

St. Luke's Church

In 1991, St. Luke's Church underwent a complete renovation. The parish hall was demolished, and in its place the Serson Clarke Apartment complex was built (named in memory of one of the former ministers of St. Luke's). Staff offices, a meeting room and class room are now located where the side aisle portion of pews used to be. All furniture in the sanctuary is moveable, allowing for different set-ups that are ideal for the performer as well as the listener. The down-sizing of the sanctuary (seating is limited to 150) has resulted in excellent acoustics for the musician and listener alike. We have opened our facilities to promote local talent and encourage the performing arts. Our intention is to share these facilities that God has given us as an act of stewardship. It is our hope that you will find these recitals entertaining and stimulating. Come and enjoy an evening of excellent music.

Attendance and offerings have steadily increased in recent years. So has the demand by artists. In fact, inquiries have already been received about our 2007-08 season!

The admission to each recital in the series is by donation: there is no set price. Please give generously, as the money received from the donations at the door is given to the artist(s).
